It begins with the theory that ancient algae (a protist) gave rise to modern plants, which have evolved unique characteristics to adapt to different environments and to reproduce. Seedless (e.g. mosses and ferns) and flowering plants are aptly differentiated, and trees receive an entire chapter explicating their deciduous and evergreen varieties. Fascinating facts abound, often in captions; pollination is fruitfully discussed; and plant posers are unmasked—get out of here, mushrooms! **Vibrant photos and diagrams provide excellent support for the text, and a final activity on color-change in leaves adds a hands-on learning opportunity.**”

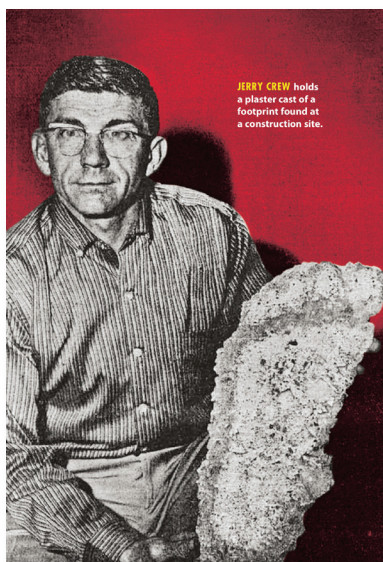
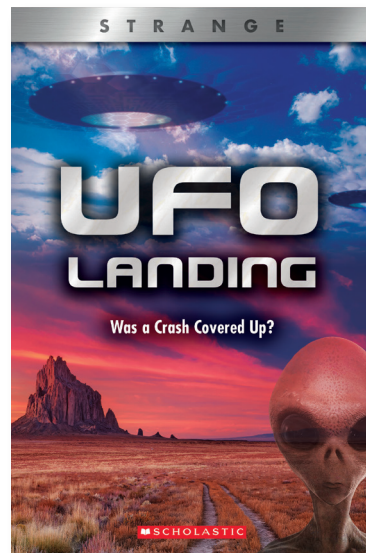
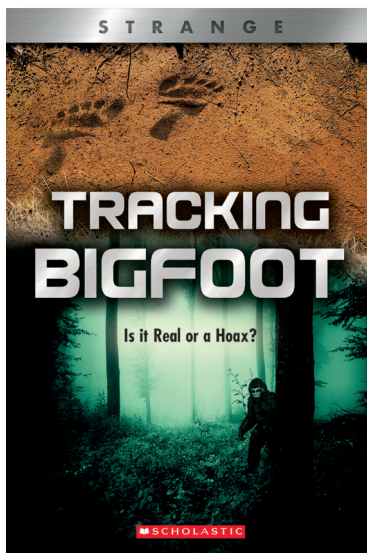

MANY PEOPLE imagined that Bigfoot looked something like this.



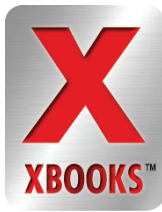

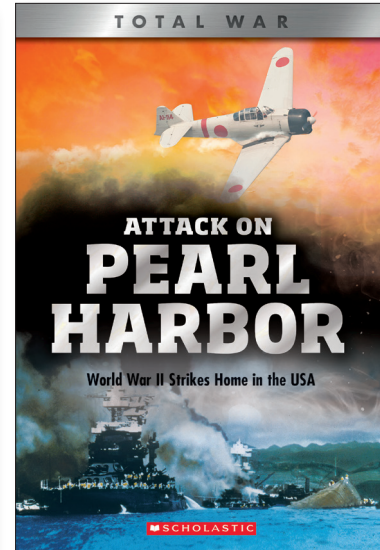
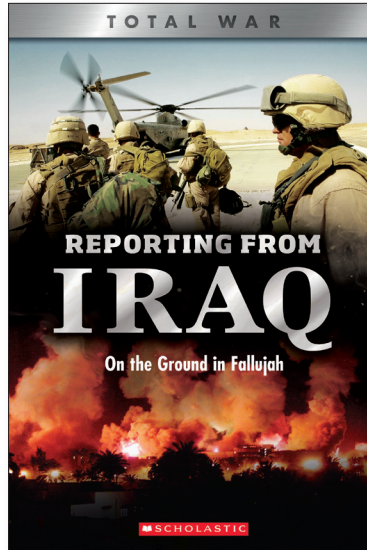

IN DEPTH

The U.S. Fleet at Pearl Harbor

There were about 130 U.S. ships in the harbor and hundreds of planes at nearby airfields. Here's a look at some of them.

SHIPS	
8 battleships	These large and powerful vessels had thick armor. Their giant cannons could pound the enemy from miles away.
8 cruisers	Cruisers were smaller than battleships. Some guarded aircraft carriers; others were used to attack enemy ships.
30 destroyers	Fast and compact, destroyers escorted larger warships and protected them from submarines and torpedo boats.
14 minesweepers	These small warships were used to find and destroy mines.
1 hospital ship	This floating hospital provided medical care for sick or injured sailors.
PLANES	
113 bombers	Among them were 12 B-17D Flying Fortresses. They got their name because they were so well armored.
200 fighter planes	These included 23 F4F-3 Wildcats, the most common carrier based fighter at the time.
105 seaplanes	Seaplanes can land on and take off from the water. If they flew from them were PBV-3 Catalina "flying boats."



AN ARMOR-PIERCING BOMB hit the ammunition hold of the USS Arizona. It set off a huge explosion that sank the ship in nine minutes. More than 1,150 crew members were killed.
