"Yes, my prices are high, but how else am I supposed to buy a *Beatsound MOTOR*? Certainly not on my allowance."

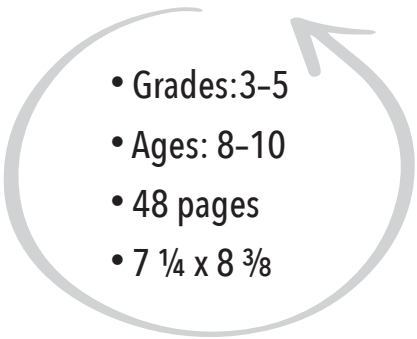
**Be an Entrepreneur!**
