It begins with the theory that ancient algae (a protist) gave rise to modern plants, which have evolved unique characteristics to adapt to different environments and to reproduce. Seedless (e.g. mosses and ferns) and flowering plants are aptly differentiated, and trees receive an entire chapter explicating their deciduous and evergreen varieties. Fascinating facts abound, often in captions; pollination is fruitfully discussed; and plant posers are unmasked—get out of here, mushrooms! **Vibrant photos and diagrams provide excellent support for the text, and a final activity on color-change in leaves adds a hands-on learning opportunity.**”

Fingerprint Processing 101		IN DEPTH	
Fingerprints can be found on different types of surfaces. So specialists use different methods to process them.			
Kind of Fingerprint	Can You See Them?	Description	How They're Processed
Patent prints	These prints are clearly visible.	These prints are made by touching something like paint or blood and then touching other surfaces.	Patent prints are photographed.
Latent prints on hard surfaces	These prints are usually invisible to the naked eye.	These prints are formed by touching hard surfaces such as glass, plastic, or metal. The oil or sweat from the skin leaves a print.	Super Glue fuming, lasers, and dusting can detect latent prints on hard surfaces. For Super Glue fuming, an object that might have a print is put in a small chamber. Fumes from heated Super Glue are released into the chamber. A chemical in the fumes sticks to the oil and traces of sweat. When the fumes dry, the fingerprint becomes easier to see.
Latent prints on soft surfaces	These prints are mostly invisible to the naked eye.	These prints are formed by touching soft or absorbent surfaces such as paper, cardboard, or unfinished wood.	Latent prints on soft surfaces can be detected with a chemical called Ninhydrin. Ninhydrin turns dark blue or purple when it comes in contact with traces of sweat from fingerprints.
Impressed prints	These prints are visible.	These prints are made by touching something like gum that leaves a clear impression of the prints.	Impressed prints are photographed. And investigators can sometimes make a mold of them.
Partial prints	These prints are sometimes visible. It depends on whether they are patent, impressed, or latent.	Partials are incomplete prints. They can be patent, latent, or impressed prints.	Software called "recognition technology" can read some partial prints. It can make identifications from incomplete data.

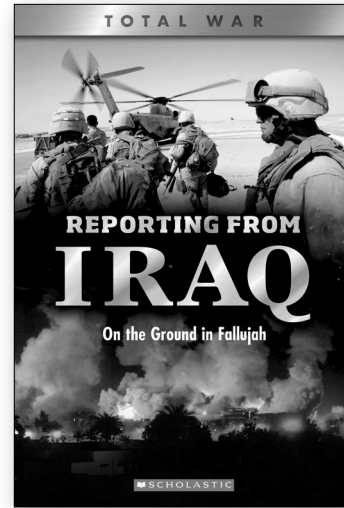
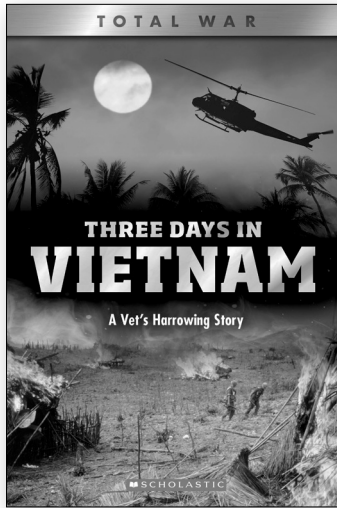
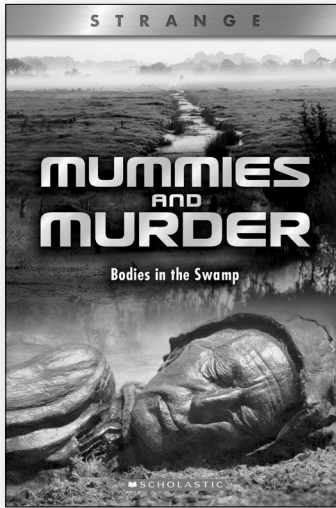
