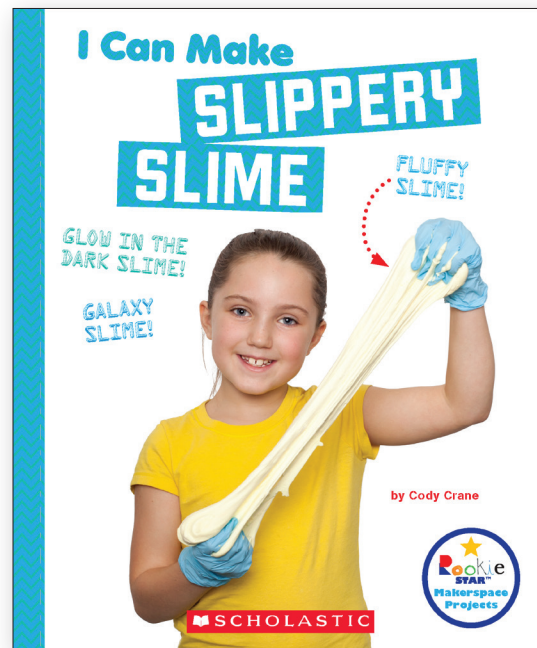

PROJECT 1

TOOLS

- 3 small mixing bowls
- Plastic spoon or flat wooden craft stick
- Paper plate

MATERIALS

- ¼ cup cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon fine glitter
- 4 teaspoons shampoo
- Blue, purple, and pink food coloring

INSTRUCTIONS

1 Pour the cornstarch into one of the bowls.

2 Carefully sprinkle the glitter on top of the cornstarch.

3 Add the shampoo to the bowl and slowly stir everything together. Add another drop or two of shampoo if the mixture is too dry. If the mixture is too wet, sprinkle in a bit more cornstarch.

4 Keep stirring until the slime is completely mixed. Then use your hands to knead the slime until smooth.

5 Divide the slime evenly between the three bowls. Add a drop of food coloring to each bowl. (Use a different color for each one.) Mix in the food coloring.

SEE IT SHIMMER

Use your hands to roll each colored slime into a tube. Lay them side-by-side on a paper plate. Twist and swirl the slimes together. The shiny bits of glitter will catch the light making the colorful slime sparkle.
